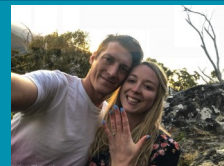

## **Important Information**

### **Signing Your Child In and Out and Late to School Process**

All children who are arriving at school after 9am or leaving school before 3.20pm MUST be signed in/out at the office.

If you need to take your child out of the school during school hours for any reason, please come to the office to sign your child out.

### **Student Absences**

If your child is absent from school for any reason, it is vital that you notify the school prior to 9am, along with the reason for the absence eg: if your child is ill, attending an appointment, family holiday etc.

Attendances and absences are recorded by the Department of Education, so it is very important that these records are maintained correctly.

Our first preference for you to notify the school is to use our Absence Notification Form on our school app. If you cannot access the online absences you can also: email your class teacher or call the office on 58241841 [followed up with a written reason]

SMS messages will be sent to parents to advise of any unexplained absences. Should you receive one of these please contact the school as soon as possible.

### **Arrival Time**

Yard supervision begins at 8:30am and we asked that children **do not arrive** at school before 8:30am. We have Before School Care to support parents who need to drop children off earlier. It is very important that all children arrive at school in time to settle and be best prepared for their day between 8.30 and 8.50am

### **Safe entering and exiting during school hours**

Hogan St Crossing is supervised and crossing rules apply to all parents/carers and children.

### **Bikes/Scooters**

Children are asked to walk their bikes /scooters through the school grounds at all times. Children riding must meet the Hunter St duty teacher and exit the school grounds using Hunter St only. For the safety of residents, we ask that children do not begin riding until after Moyola. In the morning bikes may enter either through Hunter St or Hogan St but students must walk bikes/scooters in the school grounds at all times. When entering through Hogan St bikes/scooters must be walked between the church and the Mercy Centre.

### **Car Park**

Children picked up in the car park must use the supervised crossing and wait with the supervising teacher on the hall side of the gate.

Children are not permitted to walk through the carpark unaccompanied. Parents/carers must come to the gate to meet them. If parents/carers haven't arrived by 3:30pm the supervising teacher will take their child back to the office area.

Cars must reverse into the car parks. Drivers are asked to pay particular attention when exiting the car park to children walking along the footpath. Cars must give way at all times.

### **Hunter Street gate**

Children leaving through the back gate must wait at the sports shed for the supervising teacher and walk with teacher to the Hunter St gate.

Parents/carers must leave their car to collect children if parked on the other side of the road. If parents/carers haven't arrived by 3:30pm the supervising teacher will take their child back to the office area.

### **Bus**

Bus children meet at the front of school immediately after the dismissal bell to be marked off the roll.

### **Dogs at School**

Our school policy asks that parents/carers do not have dogs on or near the school grounds during school hours without prior consultation with the classroom teacher. This includes before and after school pick up.

### **Uniform**

Our school uniform plays an important part in setting the culture of our school and parents/carers are asked to support us with the wearing of correct uniform. A note from parents is expected for any child out of uniform. These can be found on the school website or app. School sports uniform can be worn to school on days of sport/PE. Children wear sneakers on timetabled sports days. Hair should be neatly tied back if it is shoulder length or below. Hair ties to be navy, yellow or white and jewelry consist of plain sleepers and studs and a watch only.

### **Working With Children Check**

We really value all parent/carer participation in a variety of ways across the school. In order to enable you to do this you must provide a Working With Children Check. The WWCC is free for volunteers. We ask that all parents/grandparents/friends/carers who assist at the school (or intend to in the future) apply for the WWC at [www.workingwithchildren.vic.gov.au](http://www.workingwithchildren.vic.gov.au) or telephone the information line on 1300 652 879. If you need assistance with this, please come into the office. Debbie will also need a copy of your WWCC when it has been checked.

### **Sickness/ Accidents**

Please keep your children home if they are sick but contact the school before school commences. Parents/carers will be contacted if their child is too unwell to stay at school or there is any type of bump to the head. If it is considered necessary we will not hesitate to call an ambulance so it is important for families to have up to date ambulance cover. All medications must go through the office so staff can administer it at the appropriate time and record the dosage and time. Please also let the classroom teacher know.

### **Lunch Orders**

Lunches can be ordered on Thursday and Friday. The menu and price list are on the school website, app and Facebook page. Orders are placed in the class lunch bags first thing in the morning and returned to school by the morning break.

### **Children's Wellbeing**

On occasions something may be happening in your child's life that may affect their behavior or ability to settle at school. Though this may be difficult to discuss I strongly suggest that parents/carers share this with myself or the class teacher so we can best support your child while at school. Confidentiality is always assured.

We also like to share their celebrations, achievements etc. and often share these through the newsletter so be sure to let us know if something exciting is happening in your child's life.

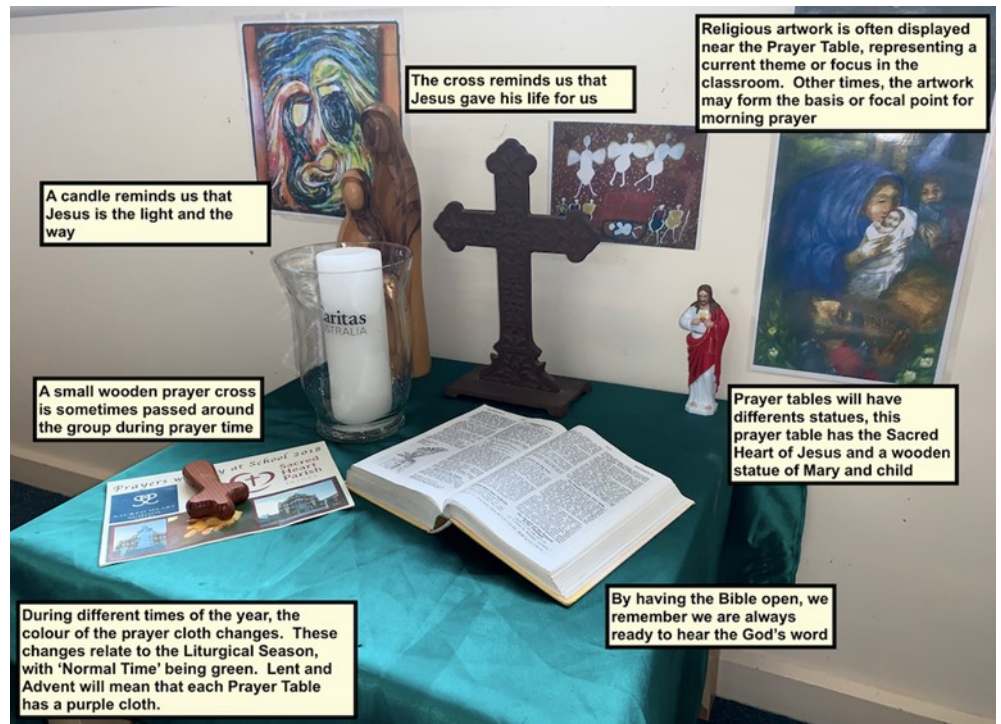


## Catholic Identity

With a focus at the beginning of each school year on classes developing their own prayer focus and pray experiences, I thought it would be a good opportunity to explain some of the elements you might find on a prayer table when you enter your child's classroom over the next few weeks. Each prayer table will be a little different and it is important to remember that the purpose of the prayer table is to focus the class so that each prayer prayed is meaningful and faith-filled. Many of the elements on the prayer reflect our continued faith development as we follow in the footsteps of Jesus.

The green coloured cloth is an important element of the prayer table shown. As the notes above outline, the colour of the cloth on each prayer table is relates to the current Liturgical Season.

As a guide: **Green:** Ordinary Time **Purple:** Advent and Lent **White:** Easter

## Pastoral Wellbeing

### LET'S PROMOTE WELLBEING AT SACRED HEART BY CASSIE WORM

Welcome back to an exciting new school year! Not only does a new year bring new challenges and new opportunities, but it is the perfect time to build some new habits to make sure this year will be successful and focused for your child.

Michael Grose, a well-known parenting educator, has outlined 6 fantastic tips for parents to help make this year more settled for your child at school.

**1. Commit to your child going to school every day on time.**

One of the most important things you can do to ensure your child has a bright future is to make sure he or she goes to school every day – and gets there on time. Kids spend more time asleep than at school, so we need to maximise every day to get full value.

**2. Help kids start each day well.** A good night's sleep, a healthy breakfast and some words of encouragement from you will help set a positive tone for a day of learning. This may mean that you adjust your morning routine so that kids have plenty of time get up, eat and get ready for the day.

**3. Establish work & study habits.** The most successful students are those that develop regular study habits that suit their lifestyle, their study style and their school's expectations. Find out the work expectations from your child's or young person's school and help them establish a work routine that matches.

**4. Make sure your child gets enough sleep.** Many children and young people are sleep-deprived, which impacts on their well-being and their learning. A good night's sleep consolidates learning, as well as assist future learning. Children need between 10-12 hours of sleep each day, while teens need a minimum of nine hours. Help kids get sufficient sleep by having a regular bed-time and get-up time each day. Have 45 minute wind-down time each night, and remove screens and mobile phones from bedrooms.

**5. Encourage kids to exercise.** Kids today get less exercise than those of past generations, which is an impediment to learning and mental health. Health professionals recommend a minimum of 60 minutes of exercise per day for kids of all ages. Encourage kids to play sport; promote free and active play and look for ways to make moving part of their daily lives.

**6. Focus on being friendly.** Schools are very social places requiring kids to negotiate many different social situations each day. Encourage kids to be open and tolerant; to be friendly; to be involved in plenty of activities and to be social risk-takers.
