*Today's reading continues the story of Jesus teaching the people that we began last Sunday. In it Jesus tells us to love our enemies and do good to those who are cruel to us. Why does he tell us to do this? What does this tell us about what God is like, and what God expects of us?*

Over the coming weeks, I'll be sharing with you some information that reminds us all that we are a Catholic School and that what we believe, what we do and what we say reflects our Catholic values each and every day. I hope you find the pieces informative and thought provoking.

### **Children's Mass**

We celebrate 'Children's Mass' each 2<sup>nd</sup> Sunday of the month during school terms. These Masses are central to the strong connection between our school and our Sacred Heart Parish. Children fulfill many roles within the Mass and sing songs they have learnt at school. Children's Mass is followed by morning tea in the Mercy Centre.

### **Church**

The original Sacred Heart church was built in 1889 with the current church being built in 1912. Of particular importance are the four stained glass windows, each representing an important element of the life of the church: St Patrick, St Bridgid, the Sacred Heart and Our Lady and Child. The Church, Sacred Heart School, Parish Hall and the Convent of Mercy in the Catholic precinct are lasting monuments to the wonderful work of past priests, parishioners and school families.

## Pastoral Wellbeing

### Let's Promote Wellbeing at Sacred Heart

Last week, the Grade 6 students attended a leadership day at St. Mary's School in Mooroopna. We listened to so many fantastic speakers and it was hard to just pick one example of showing leadership however, Fr. Rob Galea's message was one that resonated with us all.

#### **"DO IT SCARED"**



A huge part of being a leader is about showing resilience and persistence. Fr. Rob spoke to us about not letting the 'buts' in life get in the way of doing great things.

An example that he gave of "doing it scared", was when he was terrified of speaking in front of a crowd. He knew he wanted to be able to do this however he had to go through many trials to get to where he is today. He spoke of his attempts – about how he initially just laughed into a microphone and had to be led off stage and when he was just staring at the microphone with no words coming out. His message was that even though he was scared to speak in front of a crowd, he kept persisting and "doing it scared" and now, we look at where he is and what he does in life. He showed us such a great example of how persistence and resilience can help us achieve some truly wonderful things in life.

So this week, let's all aim to be the best we can be and "do it scared". Remember, that having courage doesn't mean that you are never scared or afraid; it simply means that you are taking action in spite of your fear.

## ADMINISTRATION NOTICES

### Camps, Sports and Excursion Fund - CSEF

The CSEF is an annual payment to the school to be used towards camps, sports and/or excursion costs for your children. The primary school rate is currently \$125.

Families that have previously applied for CSEF at Sacred Heart are not required to complete a new application. New families to Sacred Heart School that have a valid Healthcare card or Pension card on the first day of term are encouraged to complete an application form. Forms are available from the school office or on the school website under:

**Families who have completed a CSEF in previous years and do not have a new student at the school in 2019 do not have to fill in a new form, however a copy the HCC / Pension card valid on the first day of term (30/01/2019) is needed. Please send this in to Debbie ASAP, discounts will then be applied..**

### Conveyance Allowance

Families who live more than 4.8km from Sacred Heart School and it is the nearest Catholic Primary School may be eligible for Conveyance Allowance. Please see Debbie in the Office if you think you maybe eligible and do not already receive Conveyance Allowance.

Annual School Fee Statements were emailed out to families on Friday. If you did not receive one or there is any discrepancy please see Debbie in the office. Thank you.

## DIRECT DEBIT

*Families who paid by Direct Debit in 2018 please note that a new Direct Debit form for 2019 needs to be filled in - it does not carry over automatically.*

*This is a requirement by our Auditors that information is updated each year.*

*Forms are available on the website or from the office. Direct debits commence in March.*

## CareMonkey

Parents and caregivers are reminded to keep all details for contacts and students up to date. When changes are made on CareMonkey the administration system is notified and details are also updated there.

New families who have not submitted profiles for their students are asked to do this as soon as possible. All permission notes and important notices are sent to families through the CareMonkey App. Staff have access to details when they are on excursions, camps etc.

## Year 6 Learning and Teaching

### APOLOGY DAY

On Wednesday, 13<sup>th</sup> February, Sacred Heart acknowledged and learnt more about Apology Day. We discussed how the government decided it was time to say 'sorry' for all of the injustices Europeans' had caused the Aboriginal people.

I interviewed Sienna and Mia in Year 4 to see what they did for Apology Day.

*What did you do on Apology Day?*

Sienna: Well I grabbed stones and decorated them by remembering what Apology Day means.

*What is Apology Day about?*

Sienna: Apology Day is about saying sorry to the Aboriginal people because their land was stolen.

*What does Apology Day mean to you?*

Mia: I think that taking the land from the Yorta Yorta people is bad and it is nice to appreciate them.

*What did you learn about Apology Day?*

Mia: I learnt that it is about the government saying sorry for taking their land

*Why do you think they named it Apology Day?*

Mia: I think that they named it Apology Day because it is when we said SORRY to the Aboriginal people.

### LEADERSHIP DAY

On Wednesday, 13<sup>th</sup> February, all of the districts Year 6 students met at St. Mary's in Mooroopna to attend a Leadership Day, where we learnt about the qualities of Leadership.

We listened to some incredible and inspirational speakers such as Fabrice Manirakiza. Fabrice is a refugee rapper and he shared his amazing life story with us. Bianca Chatfield, a former Australian Netball Diamonds Captain and Vixens player, told us about how to be a leader and her approach and advice of how she did it. Bianca was also a contestant on The Block and shared her stories of stress and resilience. Father Rob Galea, an international singing priest, spoke of his life story and how he overcame his fears. He also played a song and taught us the accompanying dance movements.

We also listened to Year 12 leaders and representatives from the Secondary schools within our diocese. They spoke to us about their experiences and challenges that helped them grow into their school leaders.

It was a lot of fun and full of helpful hints. One main message we got was that 'It doesn't matter how tall, old or young you are, you just need to be you and you will make a difference.

To best prepare our children for the language & learning demands of the school environment, they need ample time and opportunity to engage in meaningful interactions with their family.

## PHONOLOGICAL AWARENESS

### WORD AWARENESS:

#### Activity 3: How many words?

Adult to say the sentence and ask the child to count the number of words in the following sentences using their fingers or counters/blocks:

- I love my family
- It is hot and I would like an ice-cream
- My holiday was filled with lots of adventures
- The cat in the hat was sitting on the mat.
- I was driving my car to work when it ran out of fuel
- I enjoy looking at the stars in the sky at night
- I really want to have a bubble bath and play with some bath toys
- Travelling on a plane can be fun when my friends or family are with me
- Riding a bike through the rough dirt road was thrilling
- Baking delicious chocolate chip cookies with my mum is so much fun

You could also choose sentence from their readers or texts.

## PHONOLOGICAL AWARENESS

### ALLITERATION:

#### Activity 4: The Food Game:
