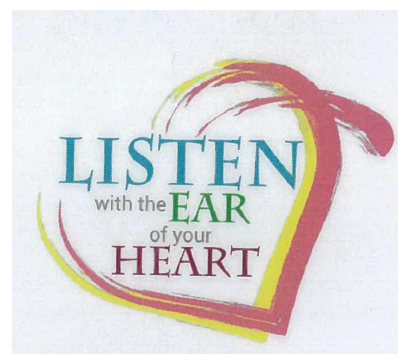
*Teach me to listen, O God,

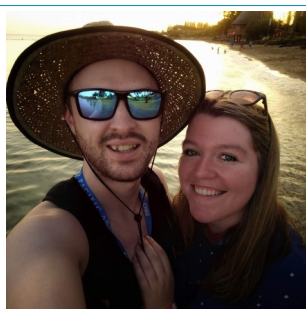

## Catholic Identity information continued from last week:

### First Friday Mass

We celebrate Mass as a whole school on the 1<sup>st</sup> Friday of each month during school terms. Each of these Masses play a significant role in the faith life of our school. Each Mass has a theme: Opening School Mass, Lent Mass, Mother's Day Mass, Feast of the Sacred Heart, Grandparent's Mass, Father's Day Mass, All Saints Day and Advent Mass. All families and parishioners are warmly invited to join us at these Masses.

### Mercy Charism

Sacred Heart Primary School was founded by the Sisters of Mercy in 1900. The values of the Sisters of Mercy are Mercy, Dignity, Quality, Commitment and Care. These are fully expressed through the lives and work of the Sisters and through their ministries in our contemporary society. Being educated in the Mercy tradition today, calls us to action in the same manner as it did more than 100 years ago when our school was born. Maintaining our Mercy tradition requires us to think, act and live out the Mercy Values. We give thanks to the Sisters of Mercy who first lit the flame in our school and all the past and present students, families and staff members who have kept it burning brightly throughout the years.

### Mini Vinnies

St Vincent de Paul Society was formed so that men and women might live out the Gospel by serving people in need. Frederic Ozanam and his young companions founded the Society in 1833 in Paris, and placed it under the patronage of the apostle of the poor, St Vincent de Paul. At Sacred Heart, students IN years 3 - 6 volunteer to meet in a group called Mini Vinnies. The students meet together to grow in awareness of the issues faced by people who experience disadvantage. Mini Vinnies members work together to raise awareness and/or funds to help support those in need, both within our local community and in our world.

## Birthday Parties

If you are only asking a select few as you as parents/caregivers are totally free to do, please be discreet about handing out the invite. We actively work with both students and families to support the growth of healthy and resilient children, but sometimes situations linked to the points above can be hurtful. We thank you for your support with this.



## ADMINISTRATION NOTICES

### Camps, Sports and Excursion Fund - CSEF

The CSEF is an annual payment to the school to be used towards camps, sports and/or excursion costs for your children. The primary school rate is currently \$125.

Families that have previously applied for CSEF at Sacred Heart are not required to complete a new application. New families to Sacred Heart School that have a valid Healthcare card or Pension card on the first day of term are encouraged to complete an application form. Forms are available from the school office or on the school website under:

Parent Information/School Forms/Administration Forms folder.

**Families who have completed a CSEF in previous years and do not have a new student at the school in 2019 do not have to fill in a new form, however a copy the HCC / Pension card valid on the first day of term (30/01/2019) is needed. Please send this in to Debbie ASAP, discounts will then be applied.**

### Missing enrolment information

We have a number of students who do not have birth certificates or Baptism certificates (if applicable) and / or immunization certificates. If you have received a note from the office stating this please send in a copy as soon as possible.

We have an audit next week and require this information. Thank you.

### DIRECT DEBIT

*Families who paid by Direct Debit in 2018 please note that a new Direct Debit form for 2019 needs to be filled in - it does not carry over automatically. This is a requirement by our Auditors that information is updated each year. Forms are available on the website or from the office.*

**Fortnightly direct debits commence this Friday, 1<sup>st</sup> March. Monthly direct debits will commence next Friday, 8<sup>th</sup> March.**

### Lunch Orders

**Parents and caregivers are asked to send the lunch orders through the school not directly to Tatura Hot Bread.**

### CareMonkey

Parents and caregivers are reminded to keep all details for contacts and students up to date. When changes are made on CareMonkey the administration system is notified and details are also updated there.

New families who have not submitted profiles for their students are asked to do this as soon as possible. All permission notes and important notices are sent to families through the CareMonkey App. Staff have access to details when they are on excursions, camps etc.

### SMS Reminder

Parents are reminded not to respond to the SMS sent by the school as it is an automated system.

### MEDICATIONS AT SCHOOL

If your child requires medication at school a note identifying the child, class, medication name, dosage, and time to be given needs to be sent to the office.

All medication is dispensed through the office and is signed off on a medication register. If the appropriate permission is not sent with the medication it cannot be given to the student. It is also a good idea to mention to the student's teacher that there is medication at the office and what time it is to be given.
