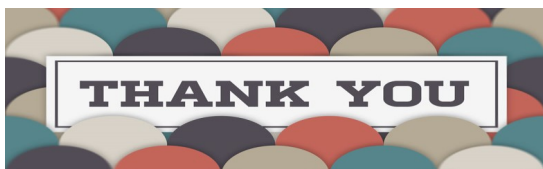

# ASH WEDNESDAY REFLECTION 06 MARCH

The rich symbolism contained in the signing of the cross in ashes on our foreheads today, reminds us to turn back to God who is full of tenderness and compassion.

In the first reading the prophet Joel says: "Call the people together, summon the community, assemble the elders, gather the children." Today this may be seen as a rallying cry, a call to live in solidarity and to work together for the common good.

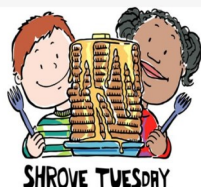
The collect prayer today speaks of a campaign of Christian service. Our campaign of service is spelt out for us in today's gospel. The prayer, fasting and almsgiving of the Christian community are a concrete sign of God's healing and transforming love. St Paul reminds us that we are ambassadors for Christ, as such our role is to be that transforming love in the lives of those sisters and brothers of ours who are among the most marginalised and vulnerable people in our world. The season of Lent reminds us why we follow the gospel teaching: "to ensure the poor are fed, the thirsty are given drink and that the poor and outcast are given welcome" [Isaiah 58:6-9].

Caritas is the international aid and development agency of the Catholic Church in Australia. Each Lent Caritas launches its Project Compassion appeal – a practical way of bringing to life our campaign of Christian service. Lent sharpens our awareness of prayer and the importance of doing good work and acting selflessly and with compassion.

Project Compassion this year asks us to focus on how lives change when we all give 100%.

Let us take time today to reflect on how we can live our Lent by committing 100% to prayer, fasting and almsgiving.

## ADMINISTRATION NOTICES

### Camps, Sports and Excursion Fund - CSEF

The CSEF is an annual payment to the school to be used towards camps, sports and/or excursion costs for your children. The primary school rate is currently \$125.

Families that have previously applied for CSEF at Sacred Heart are not required to complete a new application. New families to Sacred Heart School that have a valid Healthcare card or Pension card on the first day of term are encouraged to complete an application form. Forms are available from the school office or on the school website under:

**Families who have completed a CSEF in previous years and do not have a new student at the school in 2019 do not have to fill in a new form, however a copy the HCC / Pension card valid on the first day of term (30/01/2019) is needed. Please send this in to Debbie ASAP, discounts will then be applied.**

### Missing enrolment information

We have a number of students who do not have birth certificates or Baptism certificates (if applicable) and / or immunization certificates. If you have received a note from the office stating this please send in a copy as soon as possible.

We have an audit next week and require this information. Thank you.

### DIRECT DEBIT

*Families who paid by Direct Debit in 2018 please note that a new Direct Debit form for 2019 needs to be filled in - it does not carry over automatically. This is a requirement by our Auditors that information is updated each year. Forms are available on the website or from the office.*

**Fortnightly direct debits commenced last Friday, 1<sup>st</sup> March. Monthly direct debits will commence this Friday, 8<sup>th</sup> March.**

### Lunch Orders

**Parents and caregivers are asked to send the lunch orders through the school not directly to Tatura Hot Bread.**

### CareMonkey

Parents and caregivers are reminded to keep all details for contacts and students up to date. When changes are made on CareMonkey the administration system is notified and details are also updated there.

New families who have not submitted profiles for their students are asked to do this as soon as possible. All permission notes and important notices are sent to families through the CareMonkey App. Staff have access to details when they are on excursions, camps etc.

### SMS Reminder

Parents are reminded not to respond to the SMS sent by the school as it is an automated system.

### MEDICATIONS AT SCHOOL

If your child requires medication at school a note identifying the child, class, medication name, dosage, and time to be given needs to be sent to the office.

All medication is dispensed through the office and is signed off on a medication register. If the appropriate permission is not sent with the medication it cannot be given to the student. It is also a good idea to mention to the student's teacher that there is medication at the office and what time it is to be given.


