I hope all our visitors enjoyed their time at school visiting classrooms, being read to, being pampered and joining others for morning tea. The children were certainly excited about the day. I hope you all enjoyed your gifts that were made so lovingly for you during PPR and had a lovely, relaxing Sunday with your families.

We wish our 3/4s and their teachers all the best as they head off to the Billabong Camp next week. A major goal of this camp is to build self-management skills, complete challenging tasks through teamwork as well as spending one night away from family in the presence of peers and teachers. This will be a wonderful experience and lots of fun as classes try the Paddle Boats, Commando Course, Mini Golf, Horse Grooming, Beach Volleyball, Roping and Bungee Trampoline. 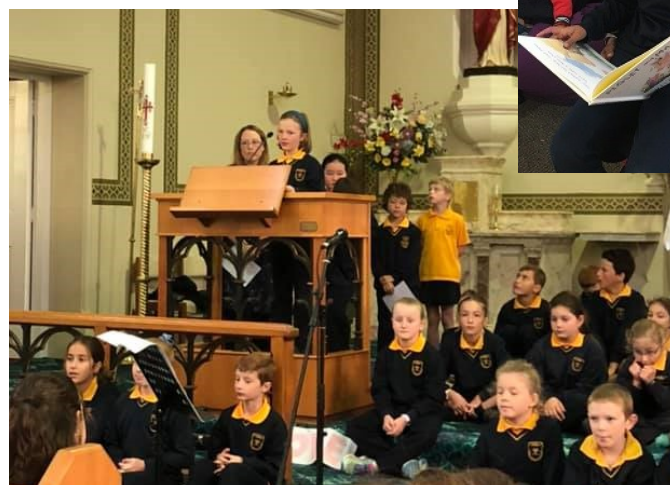

SCHOOL FEE STATEMENTS

School fee statements will be sent home last Friday. If you have any queries about school fees please see Debbie in the office.

SICKNESS AND MEDICATIONS AT SCHOOL

Children with serious colds, flus or other debilitating illnesses should always be kept home.

When children become ill, they will normally be sent to the sickbay first and observed for a little while before parents or guardians are called to collect them.

In cases of serious illness or accident, the school will either call an ambulance or arrange other emergency medical assistance. Parents or emergency contacts will be notified as soon as possible.

PLEASE DO NOT SEND YOUR CHILD IF HE/SHE HAS:

- **A fever** – a child with a fever of more than 38°C must be kept at home (or will be sent home). Seek medical advice, give child plenty of fluids.
- **Been prescribed antibiotics for an acute illness** – a child who has been prescribed an antibiotic for an acute illness should be kept home for at least 24 hours.
- **Diarrhoea** – a child who has a watery stool should not return until he/she has been free of the diarrhoea for 24 hours. Seek medical advice, give child plenty of fluids.
- **Vomiting** – a child who is vomiting should be kept home **until 24 hours after the vomiting has stopped**

In order to make sure we can always ring parents or another emergency person, please ensure that you immediately notify us if there are any changes in address or telephone numbers (through the CareMonkey App). It is essential that you inform us about any potentially serious medical conditions and/or children's medication. This information is confidential. This should be done through CareMonkey.

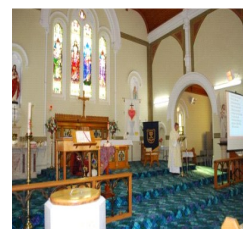

Administration Notices (repeat notices):

CareMonkey

Parents and caregivers are reminded to keep all details for contacts and students up to date. When changes are made on CareMonkey the administration system is notified and details are also updated there.

New families who have not submitted profiles for their students are asked to do this as soon as possible. All permission notes and important notices are sent to families through the CareMonkey App. Staff have access to details when they are on excursions, camps etc.

MEDICATIONS AT SCHOOL

If your child requires medication at school a note identifying the child, class, medication name, dosage, and time to be given needs to be sent to the office. The medication should be in the original container.

All medication is dispensed through the office and is signed off on a medication register. If the appropriate permission is not sent with the medication it cannot be given to the student. It is also a good idea to mention to the student's teacher that there is medication at the office and what time it is to be given.

An important reminder

Please notify the school office via a phone call, school app, note or personal visit on the day your child is absent. Teachers will require a written or electronic note as well. Parents will be contacted if their child has an unexplained absence. We ask for your support regarding this important requirement.

UNWELL CHILDREN

If your child is not well please keep them at home. It is not fair to expect a child who is unwell to participate in learning activities and we are also conscious of them spreading their illness throughout the class.

SMS Reminder

Parents are reminded not to respond to the SMS sent by the school as it is an automated system.

NOTICES

Please check the school noticeboard in the quadrangle for any notices that have not been included on the newsletter.

It is the policy of the school that only community and local sports events for children are included in the newsletter.
