## Message from our Principal



Dear Parents and Caregivers,

National Reconciliation Week [NRW] is held annually from 27<sup>th</sup> May to 3<sup>rd</sup> June and is preceded by National Sorry Day on Sunday, 26<sup>th</sup> May. These dates commemorate two significant milestones in the reconciliation journey - the successful 1967 referendum, and the High Court Mabo decision respectively. The theme of the 2019 NRW is **Grounded in Truth: Walk Together with Courage** and it is a time for all Australians from all backgrounds to 'walk together with courage' as we contribute to building stronger relationships based on historical acceptance. At Sacred Heart we will begin NRW by commissioning our F.I.R.E carriers on Monday morning. They will also attend the GV Deanery Mass with other schools at St Mary's Mooroopna on Wednesday, 29<sup>th</sup> May. Each class will also have activities planned around this significant week as it is a time for all at Sacred Heart to learn about our shared histories, cultures, and achievements and to explore how each of us can contribute to achieving reconciliation in Australia.

### National Reconciliation Week 2019

Next Monday 27<sup>th</sup> May marks the beginning of National Reconciliation Week. National Reconciliation Week runs annually from 27<sup>th</sup> May to 3<sup>rd</sup> June. These dates mark two milestones in Australia's reconciliation journey: The 1967 referendum and the historic Mabo decision.

### What did Jesus teach us about reconciliation?

In Jesus' first statement as he began his ministry, he read out a prophecy from Isaiah – outlining his priority to bring good news and freedom to the poor and oppressed: "The Spirit of the Lord is on me, because he has anointed me to preach good news to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim freedom for the prisoners and recovery of sight for the blind, to release the oppressed, to proclaim the year of the Lord's favour." (Luke 4: 16-19) As followers of Jesus, we are required to work to challenge oppression and injustice – this is part of the good news of the Gospel. Ours is a forgiving God who calls on us to live a just life together, to forgive, to reconcile, to be respectful of others, and to love one another. Without doubt there still needs to be greater understanding, respect, recognition and much more to be done to bring about equality and reconciliation in our land. We are Jesus' hands, heart and voice, as Andrew Chin's hymn "*These Hands*" we regularly listen to at school remind us, for reconciliation in the world!

## Children's Chatter Matters

To best prepare our children for the language & learning demands of the school environment, they need ample time and opportunity to engage in meaningful interactions with their family.



### Activity 6: An activity to build vocabulary, Morphology:

Morphological awareness is a skill that helps students read and spell. It involves breaking up words into their base word, prefixes, and suffixes. These can be added or taken away from a word to alter its meaning. For example, the word unhelpful can be broken into: a prefix – un (meaning not), base word – help, and a suffix – ful (meaning full of). This could be explained as: not full of help. The following activities will help develop your child's morphological awareness and improve indirectly their fluency, reading comprehension, and spelling.

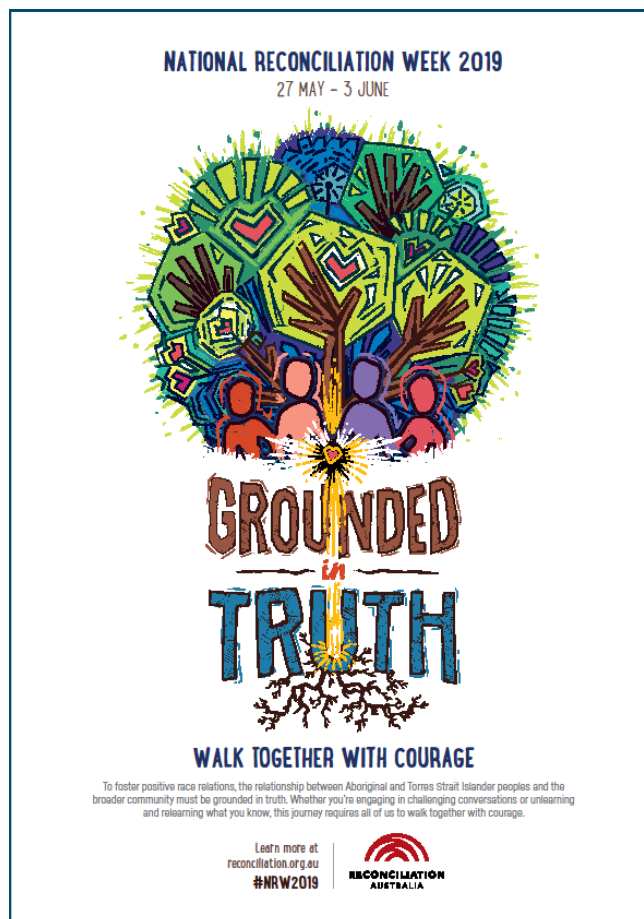
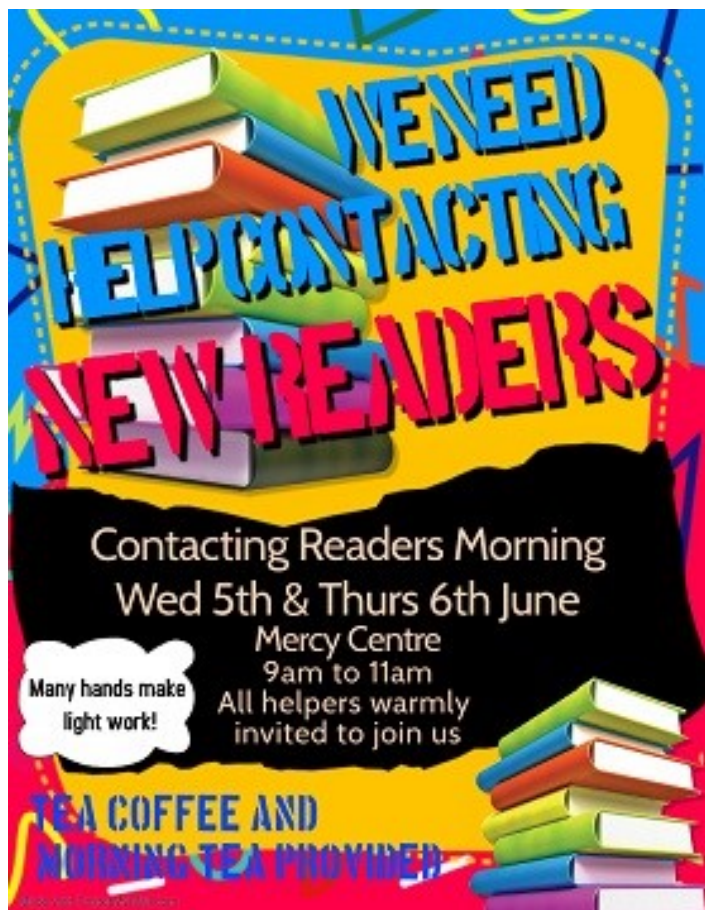
**An activity to build vocabulary - Affixes:** Tell your child that affixes are extra parts that are "fixed on" to the base word. The affixes at the beginning of words are called "prefixes" because "pre-" means before, and a "suffix" comes at the end of a base word.

Ask your child to "fix" the broken base words with the correct "affix."

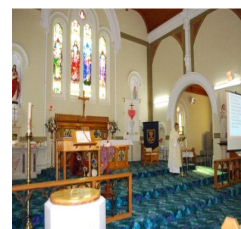

## Administration Notices (repeat notices):

### CareMonkey

Parents and caregivers are reminded to keep all details for contacts and students up to date. When changes are made on CareMonkey the administration system is notified and details are also updated there.

New families who have not submitted profiles for their students are asked to do this as soon as possible. All permission notes and important notices are sent to families through the CareMonkey App. Staff have access to details when they are on excursions, camps etc.

### MEDICATIONS AT SCHOOL

If your child requires medication at school a note identifying the child, class, medication name, dosage, and time to be given needs to be sent to the office. The medication should be in the original container.

All medication is dispensed through the office and is signed off on a medication register. If the appropriate permission is not sent with the medication it cannot be given to the student. It is also a good idea to mention to the student's teacher that there is medication at the office and what time it is to be given.

### An important reminder

**Please notify the school office via a phone call, school app, note or personal visit on the day your child is absent. Teachers will require a written or electronic note as well. Parents will be contacted if their child has an unexplained absence. We ask for your support regarding this important requirement.**

### UNWELL CHILDREN

If your child is not well please keep them at home. It is not fair to expect a child who is unwell to participate in learning activities and we are also conscious of them spreading their illness throughout the class.

### SMS Reminder

Parents are reminded not to respond to the SMS sent by the school as it is an automated system.

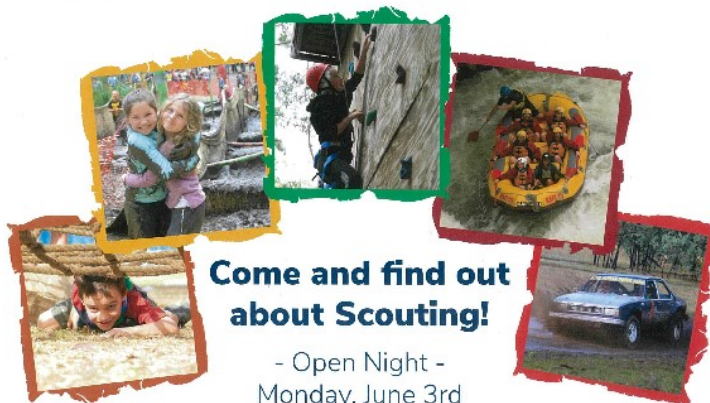
